





The purpose of the engagement is the pursuit of public health policy objectives including UHC – improve access and equity


# **Private Sector share**

OECD | Primary Care services in 15 OECD countries is predominantly delivered by the private sector




The private sector is as predominant as the public sector in delivery of primary care in OECD countries (1)

The private sector provides more than 40% of outpatient care in PAHO region (3)


### **SEARO | Initial presentation of disease symptoms**

The majority of the population in South Asia first seek care in the private sector (2)


### **EMRO | Outpatient and ambulatory services**






